

What's a GO-BAG?

Originally presented at the 2021 NCT National Rally

A bag of immediate essentials in case of emergency. Ideally the bag should travel “up front” beside the driver during the day and live beside the bed at night. **If a rig catches fire, you have 1 to 2 minutes or less to get out before the flames/toxic fumes get you!**

WHAT GOES IN THE BAG? Copies of the following, both front and back (someone at home should also have a copy):
- ID, drivers license, RV, truck, trailer, car registrations and insurance cards; - COVID vaccination card, meds and medical conditions lists, health insurance cards, health care proxy and DNR forms; - credit cards, SS card, Passport

- CASH and a credit card dedicated to travel
- 3 days of meds (be sure to refresh every 3 months), first aid kit (CVS or Walgreens)
- Change of underwear and socks, wind breaker, sweatshirt, shirt and pants
- Sneakers, rain poncho (Dollar Store), gloves, mask, sanitizer
- Flashlight, matches/lighter, knife/multi-tool
- Phone, charger and power pack, phone contact list
- Protein bars, water, sunscreen, bug repellent
- Duct tape, sheet of plastic or mylar (4'x 6' min.)

All this stuff could fill a 40 lb. pack, so you need to customize to your needs and mode of travel.

Just think about abandoning ship on a lonely road in a rain storm, or on the desert, dressed in flip flops, shorts and a tank top (or in your PJs!)
